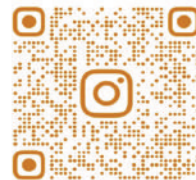

Children's Day Around the World

1. World Children's Day (United Nations)

The **United Nations** established **World Children's Day** on **20 November** to promote children's rights and well-being worldwide. This date marks the anniversary of the **Declaration of the Rights of the Child (1959)** and the **Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989)**. Countries around the world observe this day with various activities focused on children's rights, education, health, and happiness.

2. June 1 — International Children's Day

Many countries, especially in **Europe, Asia, and Africa**, celebrate **Children's Day on 1 June**. This date was adopted from early 20th-century international efforts to improve children's welfare. Countries such as **China, Russia, Poland, Vietnam, and many former Soviet states** observe it with games, school events, performances, and family activities to bring joy to children.

3. May 5 — Japan

In **Japan**, Children's Day (called *Kodomo no Hi*) is celebrated on **5 May** as part of the *Golden Week* holidays. Families display **carp streamers (koinobori)** and traditional symbols of strength and good fortune. It celebrates the health and happiness of children and has a long historical tradition in Japanese culture.

4. April 23 — Turkey

In **Turkey**, April 23 is celebrated as **National Sovereignty and Children's Day**, commemorating the foundation of the Grand National Assembly. On this day, children participate in cultural programs and symbolic activities, and they sometimes lead official roles in schools or local governments for the day.

5. Other Dates in Other Countries

Different countries celebrate Children's Day on various dates depending on cultural and historical reasons. For example:

- **Brazil: 12 October**
- **Argentina: Third Sunday in August**
- **Australia: Around 20 November** or first Sunday in July
- **Mexico: 30 April**
- **Bangladesh: Previously 17 March** (now aligned with UN date) (kidsunder7.com)



Specialty of India's Children's Day

In **India**, Children's Day is celebrated every year on **14 November**, the **birth anniversary of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru**, the first Prime Minister of independent India. Nehru was deeply fond of children and believed they were *the foundation of the nation's future and its guiding light*. Because of his love and concern for children's welfare, education, and happiness, India chose this day to honour them.

What Makes India's Celebration Special?

- The day is known as **Bal Diwas** in India.
- Schools organize **cultural programs, special events, games, and performances** for children.
- Programs often focus on **creating awareness about children's rights, education, and welfare**.
- It reminds people that children need **nurturing and support** to grow into responsible, happy adults, reflecting Nehru's philosophy that children are *the architects of tomorrow*.

New Year's Resolution-Blood Donation

Blood Donation is considered as a generous act driven by a noble purpose. It serves as a wonderful means of assisting humanity. Donors can expect to feel a deep sense of satisfaction and joy. The entire process takes just a brief period, approximately thirty minutes, to finish. However, this straightforward act of giving can have a profoundly significant impact on the recipient's life. Each blood donation has the potential to save up to three lives, as the collected blood is divided into three essential components: plasma, platelets, and red blood cells.

Giving blood not only provides direct assistance to those in need but also offers indirect benefits to the donors themselves. It reduces the iron levels in donors, consequently decreasing the risk of heart-related issues. Additionally, each donation can help burn approximately 650 calories. Before the donation process, a quick health assessment will be performed to keep track of vital health indicators.

Despite the significant advancements in technology and medicine within the healthcare sector, blood remains something that cannot be manufactured to this day. There exists a substantial gap between the demand for and supply of blood, making it crucial to boost the number of voluntary blood donors significantly. Anyone aged between 18 and 65 years, who is in good health, is eligible to donate. A minimum interval of 90 days is required between two blood donations. This selfless act is invaluable, and I encourage everyone to consider making a New Year's Resolution to donate blood at least once or twice, whether on their birthdays, wedding anniversaries, or any day they choose.

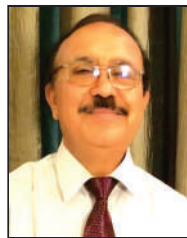

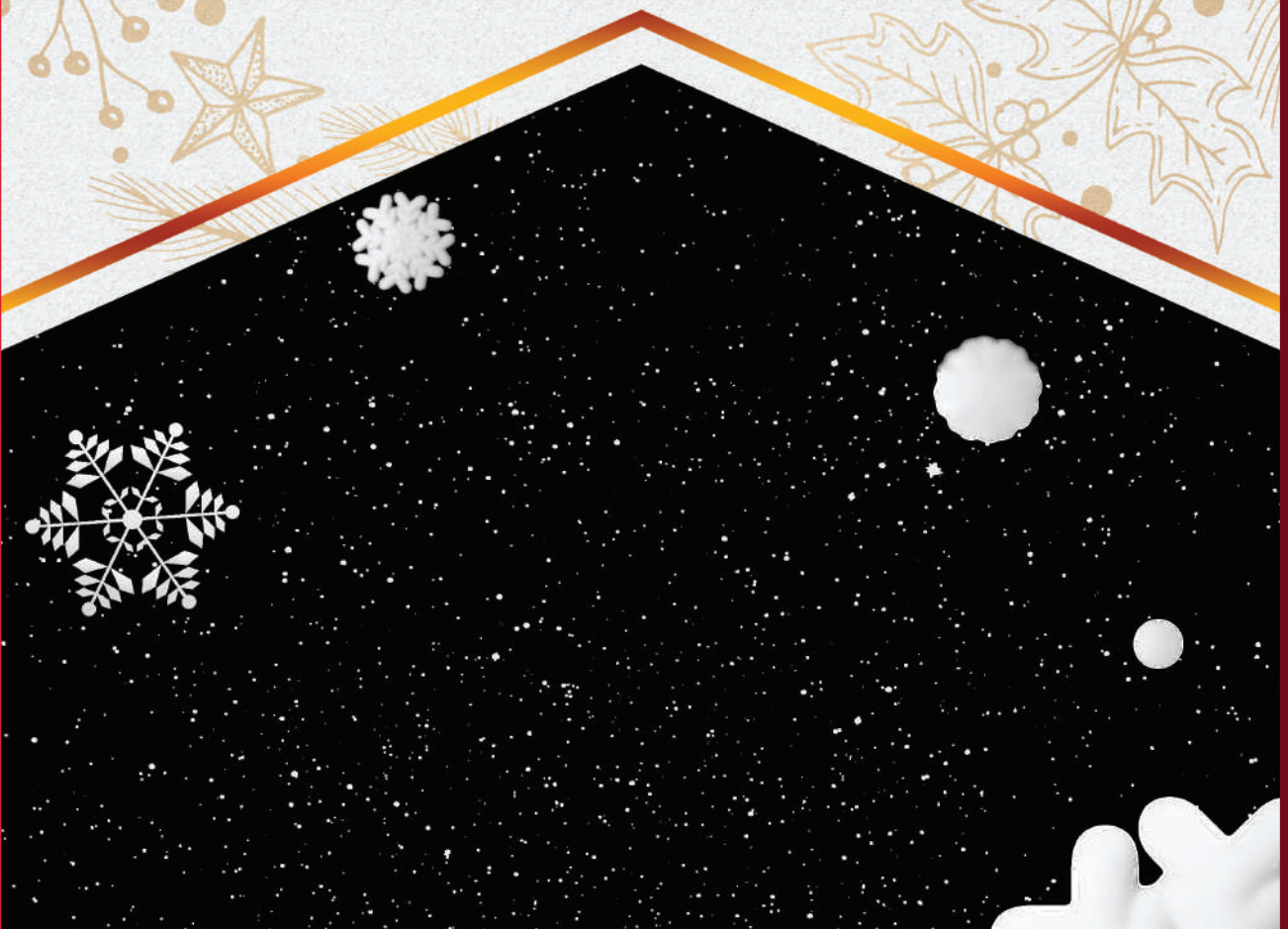
